CONVEYANCE by 1 (as trustee) by direction of 2 and 4 and at request of 3 and 5, of several pieces of land in the townships of Gorwydd, Pryske, Carvan and Doithie Pyscottwr, p. and manor of LLANDDEWI BREFI (part of Llanddewi Brefi Mountain of Sheepwalk), sold in 6 lots (of which these are lots 1, 2 and 3) under the Enclosure Act 26027 Vict. in trust to 6 for the use of Herbert Inglis Jones, an infant, for his personal estate. Recites that 6 are trustees of the will of John Jones of Derry Ormond, the trusts of which are now being carried into execution in Chancery in the case 'Jones v Powell', in which Hebert I. Jones, aged 21, is a defendant; that by Order in Chancery, it was approved that H.I.J. should bid for the sale of the said property, the purchase money to come out of sums (specified) standing to the credit of the said case and to which H.I.J. is entitled; that 5 as agent for H.I.J., had concurred with agents 2 and 4 in instructing 3 to bid and if purchased, to enter the following agreement. (a) the whole to be conveyed to 2 at the price bid by 3.

(b) 2 to convey lot 1 to 5, who is to pay 3 the price bid.

(c) 2 to convey lots 2 and 3 to 4, who is to repay 2 the price bid by 3; that the property was bought for £1,599; that by Deed Poll of even date, the Land Commissioners in consideration of £1,599 by 2, conveyed the premises to 1 in trust for 2.

Consideration: £1,599 to be paid to account of 2 in conformity with a certificate of repayment of the like sum so advanced and paid by 2 to the Land Commissioners.

Plan and schedule: 6 chains to 1 inch.

Endorsed: that this is the indenture marked C referred to in the affidavits of John Evan Jones and John Ernest Lloyd, 25 June 1886.

### Description

*Petitioners:* Joan of Kent, Princess of Wales, mother of Richard II.

*Name(s):* Kent, Princess of Wales, Joan

*Addressees:* King.

#### *Nature of request:*

Joan requests that whereas she was assigned in dower certain lands, manors and lordships in North Wales, the county of Merionethshire, the commotes of Dinllaen and Cymydmaen, and a yearly rent from the Abbot of Bardsey, in South Wales the county of Cardiganshire, except the castle and town of Aberystwyth, although she now has that in exchange and so has the whole county, the commote of Mabedrud, the vills of Trefilan and Maenor Silian, and the third part of the lordship of Haverfordwest, as the third part of the principality of Wales, to have and to hold as fully and freely as the prince held the principality in his life, though all the judiciary of the principality remains in the hands of her son, that the King grants that she may make justices by her own commission to hold their sessions from time to time, and do all that belongs to the office of justice in those parts, and issue all manner of writs and commissions by her deputies under the seal of the princess, as fully as the King does in his two parts of Wales.

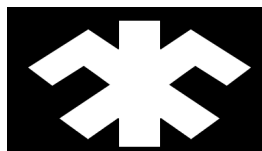
#### *People mentioned:*

#### *Date derivation:*

Dated by Rees to 1385, since this is the date of the Chancery warrant with which it was formerly enclosed (C 81/489 no.3644).

600 years later (and after the Lovers Graves episodes), Glandenyys was again of local and national interest.
